Alleluia! Christ is risen!

Psalm 21 speaks of that very resurrection. It does describe an earthly salvation that God has provided to King David at a particular time and place in history. But like many psalms and other Old Testament accounts, it also points us forward to a deeper, greater, eternal reality. Read again vv. 2–7 with Jesus in mind:

² You have given him his heart's desire and have not withheld the request of his lips.
³ For you meet him with rich blessings; you set a crown of fine gold upon his head.
⁴ He asked life of you; you gave it to him, length of days forever and ever.
⁵ His glory is great through your salvation; splendor and majesty you bestow on him.
⁶ For you make him most blessed forever; you make him glad with the joy of your presence.
⁷ For the king trusts in the Lord, and through the steadfast love of the Most High he shall not be moved.

In this Easter season, it's hard *not* to see Jesus here. He is the one who is crowned king. Though He died, He received eternal life ("length of days forever and ever.") His glory is great. He has the splendor and majesty of the Father. He is blessed forever and shall not be moved.

But that's not where the psalm ends. It continues with the implications of this victory over death. Salvation is an ongoing reality for those living in Christ's kingdom. He finds and defeats all our enemies. Sin is eradicated. Death is overturned. Satan is left powerless. Though they still afflict us, "our vict'ry has been won; the Kingdom ours remaineth."

Psalm 21 then ends with an invitation to you. While the rest of the psalm is written to Yahweh about His King, verse 13 pulls us into the story. "*We* will sing and praise your power." Based on all that God has done in saving His King (and in saving *us* through these actions,) you and I are invited to praise Him.

That's what Easter is all about for us. It's yet another chance for us to sing the praises of Christ, victorious over the grave. And because He has risen from the dead, you too will rise to eternal life with Him.

Alleluia! Christ is risen!





April 7 "Healing Waters," Syrian commander Naaman travels to see the prophet Elisha, hoping to find a cure for his leprosy. Taking along letters of introduction from the king of Syria, silver and gold, and new clothing, Naaman travels first to the king of Israel. Fearing reprisal from the Syrians, the king sends Naaman away. Naaman is directed to Elisha's house, where a messenger tells him to go wash in the Jordan seven times. Despite his initial resistance, Naaman washes, and his flesh is transformed like that of a little child.

Memory Challenge: Bless the Lord ... who heals all your diseases. Psalm 103:2-3



April 14 "Unwilling Prophet" Jonah, a reluctant prophet, tries to flee God's calling to declare His message to Nineveh. Attempting to escape by boat, Jonah finds himself cast into the sea, swallowed by a great fish, praying for deliverance, and spit up on the beach three days later. The people of Nineveh receive and respond to the message Jonah delivers, repenting of their sins before God. Angered at God's mercy, Jonah heads out of the city to sulk. There, God reminds Jonah who is in control.

Memory Challenge: For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord, Romans 6:23

April 21

"Promising Prophet." In an amazing vision of the Lord in glory upon His throne in heaven, God asks Isaiah, "Whom shall I send?" Isaiah responds, "Here I am! Send me." (Isaiah 6:8). Isaiah's prophecies extend beyond the destruction and captivity of Judah to the extensive details concerning the coming of the Messiah and His sacrifice for the salvation of His people.

Memory Challenge: By His wounds you have been healed 1 Peter 2:24

April 28

"The Praying King," tells the account of Hezekiah. When Hezekiah becomes king over Judah, he removes the altars and idols. Having conquered Israel, the king of Assyria attacks Judah, mocking Hezekiah and God. Reassured by the prophet Isaiah, Hezekiah appeals to God to uphold and protect His people. Isaiah responds by prophesying the defeat of Sennacherib's army. That night, the angel of the Lord strikes down 185,000 of the Assyrians.

Memory Challenge: Hear my prayer, O Lord. Psalm 143:1

The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay." Matthew 28:5-6


